



# **USE YOUR GIFTS!** Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth!

(PS. 104:CF. 30)

#### I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth!

I am a scientist AND I believe in God! Why do I need to say that? Ask my First Communion children about the story – we had a great discussion after I told them! A few decades back, a father and his two young sons were in a bookstore. While the boys were looking at children's science books on a table, the father said, "Don't look at those books. Scientists don't believe in God." I was standing right next to them; I was shocked, cut to the bone, but didn't respond - something that I regret to this day! As a scientist, I am constantly asking questions. Sometimes I find the answers; but most times, it leads to more questions. Of course. I have asked myself why I believe

in God in the first place. I am sure that it started from my parents' unshakable faith, but as I get older, I learned that it goes much deeper than that. I ask myself another question – What is the alternative to believing in God? Perhaps the alternative

is believing that all of creation is an accident, happenstance, and that my life has no purpose. How can I look at the wonder and beauty of all of creation, and not believe in our awesome God? How can I believe that each of us has no purpose in life - that our lives are meaningless, that my life is meaningless? So, at this point in my life, I focus on another question:

#### How can I repay the Lord for all the good he has done for me? (Ps 116:12)

One way is to thank God for everything...all that He has made...all the blessings that God has given me. Another way is to believe in and follow His Son.

#### I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, Our Lord!

Yes, I believe in Jesus, that He is my Savior, that He died for my sins, my offenses. I believe that He gives us hope even in the midst of the worst situations, as in the words of St. John Paul II "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are an Easter people and Hallelujah is our song!" If I believe in Jesus, the Blessed Hope, then I ask, what is the best way to follow Him? Is it enough to try and be a good person, and go to Church? That's probably a good start, but I think Jesus wants more from us... more compassion, more acceptance, more love, more forgiveness. I look to Christ's disciples for answers, especially after His death. For example, Mary of Magdala at the tomb, and the two disciples on the road to Emmaus – they didn't recognize the risen Lord at first. How were they able to see His face? I realized with those Easter stories. that Jesus wants us to see His face too, but in all people. After all, we are all children of God. I ask myself - Do you see the face of Christ in others? Am I able to accept, love and forgive someone...all people? It is not easy sometimes, but Jesus provides His life as a model for us, and sent us an Advocate, the Holy Spirit, who will guide us to all truth. The truth that is different from just knowledge and answers. The truth that can make us be more loving, more forgiving, true disciples of Christ.

#### How can I repay Jesus for all He has done for me?

One way is to thank Him for everything...all that He has given me and given up for me. Another way is to believe in and be open to the Holy Spirit, and strengthen and grow His church.

#### I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Holy **Catholic Church!**

I not only believe in the Holy Spirit, I can feel the action of the Spirit in my life and in the church. Can't you? I can feel the gentle signs, sometimes in a reading from the Bible, or in a Priest's homily, or in a beautiful hymn, or when someone simply

plants a seed in my mind and heart. I have been inspired by other disciples in our church to share my gifts, sometimes in ways I never expected. Have you been inspired to share your gifts? If not, then perhaps your answer lies in the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians...look to the

spiritual gifts we have been given "for some benefit". Never underestimate the power of the Spirit that has been granted to you as a disciple of Christ! Using your gifts will have some benefit, even if you do not see the effect. Lord, send out your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth!

#### How can I repay the Holy Spirit and the Church for all the good they have done for me?

During this Easter season especially, I find myself asking this question quite often. The Lord has provided me, my family, and my church many blossings. How can I repay Him? Perhaps you have the same question? Allow the Holy Spirit to inspire you to use your gifts to strengthen and grow the church, and renew the face of the earth!


