

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER, Sunday of Divine Marcy

### "Receive the joy of your glory, giving thanks to God, who has called you into the heavenly kingdom, alleluia."

HIS IS AN ALTERNATE ENTRANCE ANTIPHON FOR TODAY. Yes! Receive the joy! That is one of the great themes of this

Easter Season. We proclaim it with the beautiful flowers decorating the church, the white vestments worn by the priest, the

music we sing and the return of the alleluia, absent all during Lent.

In the church of my childhood on Holy Thursday there was a cacophony of sound - the organ truly pealing, the big church bells chiming, the small altar bells ringing and ringing and then the bells were silenced, and only a wooden clacker accompanied us. As we moved into the celebration of Good Friday, Holy Saturday, this quiet signaled our sorrow. Today the entrance hymn concludes with alleluia, at the end of Mass our celebrant will repeat alleluia, alleluia! Our music is exuberantly joyous. We are giving thanks for the joy we are receiving in this season.

SECOND GREAT THEME TODAY IS FAITH. In the Collect we praise our God of everlasting mercy who kindles our faith. The Gospel story of doubting

Thomas ends with the words of Jesus: "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed." Yes, this is a special invitation to us. Indeed, we have not seen the crucified Lord, not seen the wounds in his hands and feet, the wound in his side. Some of our iconography emphasizes the suffering Christ, for example on the face of Jesus blood from the crown of thorns, his face clearly in torment. (As a child I was saddened by a small framed picture with this image on my aunt's dresser.) Today the iconography of our crucifixes sometimes emphasizes that Jesus is risen, he has overcome death, he is in glory. Salvador Dali's Crucifixion which hangs at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City shows Christ practically levitating in front of the cross, no wounds visible on his hands, feet, side. (Met officials say this is the single most visited painting in their collection.) Yes, the Passion of Jesus, celebrated particularly in the Stations of the Cross, is an important story for us. But it is the Resurrection that is the central truth of our faith, the center of our hope, that in which we are called to place our trust. In the Polish tradition the classic greeting at Easter time is "He is risen," and the response is "He is truly risen."



And where can we see Christ, the risen Christ so that our faith can be strengthened? For me, there are various special moments. One is during the Communion procession each Sunday. My faith is strengthened when I see parents, children in arms, children led by the hand, children walking close to them, the faith of the parents being taught to their children in their very actions. It is strengthened by the persons who are infirm, approaching the altar with canes, walkers, even a portable oxygen machine, their faith in the presence of the Lord, here, now, sustaining them. So many individuals and groups strengthen my faith: neighbors who reach out to those who are in sorrow, or sick; those inspired by the teaching of Pope Francis who are working for the good of our planet; those who in a special way see the face of Jesus in the poor, serving in soup kitchens; those who remember that Jesus himself was a migrant, escaping to Egypt, who serve at the border, and in

communities throughout the country, including Montclair. All these people, young and old, serve as icons of faith for me. After all, they are the Body of Christ, making Him visible in our world today. They are fulfilling the command of Jesus heard in today's gospel: "As the Father has sent me, so I send you." They are Faith made visible, for us.

#### A Five Week Easter Series with Fr Jared Brogan



**FR. JARED BROGAN** was born and raised in Brooklyn, NY. He was educated at Xavier High School, Manhattan, St. Joseph's University, NY (BA in Speech Communications) and the Steinhardt Graduate School of Education at New York University (MA in Speech-Language Pathology). He completed his studies for the Priesthood at St. John's University, Queens, NY, Immaculate Conception Seminary, Huntington, NY, and Theological College at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC. On May 28, 2011 Fr. Jared was ordained a priest

by Bishop Serratelli. Prior to entering the seminary, he worked as a Speech-Language Pathologist for the New York City Department of Education. Fr. Jared has ministered in various capacities throughout his priesthood. He served as parochial vicar at St. Margaret of Scotland, Morristown, NJ (2011-2013); St. Philip the Apostle, Clifton, NJ (2013-2015); and pastor of St. Catherine of Siena, Mountain Lakes (2015-2020). He also served as an assistant vocation director (2014-2017). Fr. Brogan has been part of various diocesan committees, on the Presbyteral Council and College of Consultors for several terms, and on boards and membership in national groups including the Federation of Diocesan Liturgical Commissions. In January 2021, he was appointed Director of the Office of Divine Worship and Diocesan Master of Ceremonies for the Diocese of Paterson. That same year, he began further studies at the Liturgical Institute, University of St. Mary of the Lake at Mundelein Seminary, completing a Licentiate in Sacred Theology in 2023 (Liturgical Studies and Sacramental Theology). In August 2023, Father Brogan was appointed an adjunct professor of Systematic Theology at Immaculate Conception Seminary School of Theology.
